

The Danilchick Family Endowment for Pastoral Studies Workshop Report Form

Grants from the Danilchick Family Endowment are conditional upon Doctor of Ministry students completing a public presentation based on their work in the D.Min. program prior to the beginning of each semester in which financial aid is provided. This requirement is inclusive of both the **Continuing Education Grants** (*available regardless of need, set at 25% of tuition*) and **Need-based Financial Aid** (*up to 50% of tuition*): even if a student is receiving both kinds of financial aid, only one presentation must be given each semester.

Presentations must be made at the diocesan, national, or international level; presentations to a single parish community do not qualify. Students may also make arrangements with the SVS Advancement team to make their presentations at seminary sponsored webinars before the pertinent deadline.
