

**The Danilchick Family Endowment for Pastoral Studies**  
**APPLICATION FOR D.MIN. GRANT & NEED-BASED AWARD**  
**Academic Year 2018–2019**

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**Instructions**

The **Danilchick Family Endowment for Pastoral Studies** was established in 2013 by a generous gift from Protodeacon Peter and Tanya Danilchick to enhance the Doctor of Ministry program of study at St Vladimir’s Seminary. This program is intended to provide the most advanced opportunity for pastors to further their ministries and prepare the church for a new generation of leaders formed in a full Orthodox educational context. This endowment is used to provide continuing education grants and need-based awards to qualified students enrolled full-time in the Doctor of Ministry program.

**A. Continuing Education Grant.** All full-time Doctor of Ministry students, regardless of need, are eligible for continuing education support, calculated as a percentage of tuition. **Applicants must complete sections 1, 2, and 4.**

**B. Need-Based Financial Aid Award.** Full-time Doctor of Ministry students with demonstrated financial need are also eligible for a need-based financial aid award. **Applicants must complete sections 1, 2, 3, and 4.**

**Application Deadline.** Applications—mailed or emailed to the director of financial aid—must be submitted by April 1. Late applications will be considered only if funds remain available. Need-based awards are distributed per term to eligible students who are making satisfactory progress toward completion of the Doctor of Ministry program; continuing education grants are applied to student accounts upon submission of an acceptable workshop report. Students are eligible for continuing education grants and need-based awards only for the number of terms normally required to complete the program.

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**2. Continuing Education Grant**

For 2018–2019, continuing education grants are set at 25% of tuition. Grant recipients must prepare and deliver at least one workshop in their field of pastoral study each year they receive a continuing education grant from the Danilchick Family Endowment. The workshop must be intended for an audience beyond the student’s local parish community, such as, a diocesan assembly, a pan-Orthodox conference, a deanery retreat, etc. *A workshop report is due to the D.Min. program director no later than May 15 of the grant year. Students who do not fulfill the terms of the grant, which include timely submission of the workshop report, are ineligible to receive the grant.*

**3. Need-Based Financial Aid Award**

a. For 2018–2019, need-based awards are set at 50% of tuition, not to exceed the difference between academic year expenses for the degree program (see [www.svots.edu/admissions/tuition-and-expenses](http://www.svots.edu/admissions/tuition-and-expenses)) and expected family contribution (EFC). Expected family contribution is based on the income and resources of both student and, if married, spouse.

b. **U.S. citizens or U.S. permanent residents** must also complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), which generates a Student Aid Report (SAR) with EFC. The seminary's Title IV school code for the FAFSA is G02833. *Failure to use this code will cause a delay in the processing of your award.* A signed copy of **2016** income tax returns and **2016** W-2 form(s) are required only for students selected for verification during the FAFSA process. FAFSA applications are made online at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov), beginning October 1.
